**BOOKS:** *The Nile Post - Handbook & Catalogue of Egyptian Stamps* by Joseph H. Cahlhoub and collaborators. Here is a very big book of 861 pages including 32 color plates showing rare essays, proofs, classic blocks, and modern color trials and varieties. Essays are treated in great detail (71 pages) including many you've never seen before. These are followed by the Classics and the later Definitives, the Commemoratives and Miniature Sheets, the Airmails and Officials and Postage Dues and Express stamps, the Army Post and British Forces stamps, the Suez Canal Company issue, the French stamps for Alexandria & Port Said, the Postal Stationery (including proofs and varieties galore), the Palestine (Gaza Strip) issues, and the first Sudanese issues (the "SOUDAN" overprints on Egyptian stamps and stationery). Everything is priced, including all the essays & proofs and other treasures from the Palace Collection sold in 1954. There is much more here than in any earlier catalogue - more explanatory text, more illustrated & priced varieties, and more weight (if you drop this book on your foot, you might break bones). It has a sturdy cloth cover and a colorful dustwrapper showing Joe Chalhoub smiling at us. (If you are in England you should buy this book from John Sears or Vera Trinder, and if elsewhere in Europe from James Bendon; posting from here will be slow and costly or quick and very costly.) The price is \$115. Postpaid to you in the U.S.A. . . . \$ 120.

*Egypt - Stamps & Postal History - A Philatelic Treatise* by Peter A.S. Smith, (published February 1999). Here are more than nine hundred pages with thousands of illustrations and sixteen color plates. There are chapters on The Napoleonic Post, The Posta Europea, The Foreign Post Offices in Egypt (Greek, Austrian, British, Italian, French, and Russian: 85 pages), The First Issue, The Second Issue, The Suez Canal Company stamps, The Third Issue, The Fourth Issue, the 1914-21 Pictorials, The Crown Overprints, the First Portrait Issue, The Second Portrait Issue, The Farouk issues, Commemoratives, Official Stamps and Services, Postage Due Stamps and Practices, Airmails, Express Stamps and Services, Postal Markings and Cancellations, Hotel and Proprietary Post Offices, Consular and Territorial Post Offices (including scarcity factors for the 19th century Levantine and Sudanese postmarks and covers), Travelling Post Offices and Rural Service, Maritime Mail, Postal Stationery, Interpostal Seals, Sinai, Palestine: Egyptian Administration, Meters and Mechanical Franking, Diplomatic Franking, Postal Rates, Postal Paper, Military Mails, Scarcity and Value of Covers, Stamps for the British Forces, Unissued Stamps: Phantoms and Fantasies, Some Past Collectors of Egypt, The Philatelic Literature of Egypt, and still more. It has a sturdy light brown cloth cover and a colorful dustwrapper with two pictures and a short biography of Peter Smith. Totally awesome. This masterpiece, hardbound and with a dustjacket, will surely please you. Postpaid to anywhere . . . . . \$ 195.
